Meeting Called to Order: Mayor John Campolong called meeting to order.

Motion to approve Minutes from the June 27, 2017 (July) Regular Council Meeting and the August 1, 2017 Regular Council Meeting, made by Mayor John Campolong, seconded by Council Member Charlie Sutton. All were in favor.

Motion to accept Resolution 2017-2 – 2017 Chesterfield County Hazard Mitigation Plan made by Mayor John Campolong, seconded by Council Member Charlie Sutton. Two in favor, one abstained in order to review the mitigation plan.

Reports

Administrator: Terri King

The Town received a SC PARD Grant in the amount of \$14,000 to seed the baseball fields and to build a shelter at the McBee Recreation Complex. The Town will be required to expend \$17,500 in order to receive the grant of \$14,000.

Council Member Beulah Bolton

Letters were sent to the local churches asking if there was an interest in adopting the entrance signs coming into McBee. I received one response from McBee Presbyterian and have met with Mr. McLeod, who was appointed by the church to work on the project, to discuss the project. Their church has agreed to adopt the sign coming in from Charlotte on Hwy. 151.

A few meetings ago, I discussed the problem with not having street signs in McBee. Did we find out who is responsible for putting up street signs?

Mayor Campolong: I spoke with the DOT before and was told that the Town would be responsible for replacing the missing street signs. The cost was not something the Town could incur at the time we checked on it.

Council Member Bolton: Let's check to see if there is a grant that is available for this type of project.

Council Member Charlie Sutton

Worked with William to clear the overhang of tree limbs at the intersections within the Town.

Do we have any emergency plans for the storm that may come over the weekend?

Mayor Campolong: No, we don't have any particular plans. The County is keeping us advised as to the status of the storm.

Mayor John Campolong

The hearing for the Election Commission case is scheduled for September 27, 2017 at 10:30 a.m. at the Chesterfield County Courthouse. The hearing for the case with the injunction against the Town from supplying our own water to the Town will also be held on September 27, 2017 at 2:00 p.m.

Public Comments:

Concerned citizen requested that the intersection at 8th and Juniper be cleared of vegetation.
